INVESTMENT #1 Lab Expansion at NRRI Duluth Facility (\$4-6M)

- **Problem:** Larger and more complex research demands expanded infrastructure.
- **Request:** New flexible laboratory space to house state-of-the-art instrumentation and researchers in aquatic ecology, water management, forestry, and wildlife studies and minerals research.
- Innovation: Space will be strategically designed to adapt to multiple uses as research needs change.
- **Impact:** Increase research capacity and turn-around, update analytical tools, provide students opportunities in applied research, engage collaborators and partners, deliver science that brings value to Minnesota.

INVESTMENT #2 New Mineral Processing and Metallurgy Building at NRRI Coleraine (\$4-5M)

- **Problem:** 1930s-era buildings present difficulties in supporting state-of-the-art equipment needs and capabilities expansion.
- **Request:** A new mineral processing facility to engage industry partners and demonstrate emerging technology opportunities.
- Innovation: NRRI is investing in globally-unique equipment and capabilities to support the Iron and Minerals of the Future Initiative with State, Federal and Industry support.
- **Impact:** Enhanced Minnesota minerals portfolio coupled with reduced carbon footprint, reduced energy/water consumption, and enhanced management of environmental impacts.
